**FOREST PARK POLICE DEPARTMENT
ASSET SEIZURE AND FORFEITURES
JULY AND AUGUST 2018**

Following is a summary of Asset Seizure and Forfeiture activity by the Forest Park Police Department in July and August 2018. All money, vehicle, and property seizures made by this department are in compliance with Illinois Statutes on drug and money laundering forfeiture laws (Illinois Compiled Statutes, Chapter 725, Article 150/5) and other vehicle seizure laws (Chapter 720, Article 36).

NEW CASES

On 31 August 2018, this department seized \$15,407 USC from two defendants during a traffic stop. During the investigation, cash was discovered on the person of both defendants as well as inside the vehicle. Both defendants disavowed any knowledge of the money and stated it did not belong to them. Both defendants had a history of drug arrests, and no verifiable income. Both defendants also signed a disclaimer of ownership form for the money discovered. The money was seized under the Money Laundering Article from "John Doe".

CASES CLEARED

On 09 August 2018, a defendant reached a settlement agreement with the State's Attorneys Office regarding \$1,117 USC that had been previously seized. The defendant agreed to receive \$115 USC back from this department, and the remaining \$1,002 USC would be forfeited. A check was issued to the defendant for \$115.00, and the remaining money is eligible for claim through Illinois State Police.

On 14 August 2018, a Declaration of Forfeiture was issued in a case in which \$1,323 total USC was seized from two co-defendants in a narcotics delivery case, indicating that no verifiable claim to the seized money has been made. That cash is eligible for claim 30 days from that date.

On 30 August 2018, a Declaration of Forfeiture was issued in a case in which \$316 USC that was seized during a narcotics investigation, indicating that no verifiable claim to the seized money has been made. This money is eligible for claim 30 days from that date.

2018 TOTAL ACTIVITY

In 2018 to date, the Forest Park Police Department initiated fourteen new seizure cases. Total cash seized is **\$26,983.00**. Two vehicles have also been seized by this department during this time, with an estimated value of **\$24,646**.



Criminal Investigations Division

Detectives / Tactical Response Unit / Community Policing



July / August 2018

The Forest Park Police Department's Criminal Investigation Division (CID) is headed by Lt. Ken Gross. Three detectives are assigned to CID; Det. Nick Petrovic, Det. Jarlath Heveran, and Det. Rob Bryant. There are two tactical officers assigned to the division; Det. Dan Pater and Det. George Hickey. CFMH Mike O'Connor is the police department's Community Policing / Crime Free Housing Officer. LaShan Riggins, the department's Evidence Custodian, is a member of CID and aside from her evidence duties performs administrative duties for the investigators, assists communications, and parking, and records. ProCare Crisis Care Worker, Elizabeth Budde, is outsourced to the Forest Park Police Department four days a week and is housed within the CID building located at 501 Desplaines Ave.

Police incident reports are reviewed by the investigations division every working day. Incidents that have victims wishing to sign a complaint against an offender are assigned to a detective for further review in an effort to develop an offender(s), conduct interviews, and gather evidence to effect an arrest and present a winnable case in criminal court. Some incidents are turned over to Elizabeth Budde should there seem to be a need for outreach from her organization. Other incidents, for example neighbor disputes or landlord tenant disputes, are forwarded to CFMH Mike O'Connor so he could intervene and, for example, possibly mediate or offer eviction advice. When active, the unit's tactical

officers work in a plain clothes capacity and typically self-initiate activity, with a focus on crimes in progress, felony crimes, and gang and narcotics suppression.

Detectives Petrovic, Heveran, and Bryant are members of the West Suburban Major Crimes Task Force (WESTAF) and are, at times, on call to assist member agencies should a homicide occur.

Tactical Officers Pater and Hickey are assigned to assist the West Suburban Drug and Gang Enforcement Task Force (WEDGE). There is nothing to report reference WEDGE this period.

There were a total of 100 incidents assigned to detectives this period, 49 in July 2018 and 51 in August 2018. This is a 27 case decrease since the prior period that ran from May 2018 to June 2018. There are 16 less cases than in July/August 2017 when there were 116 incidents assigned to investigators.

Following are incidents of note in July/August 2018:

- CR# 1801819 – Detectives were able to identify and locate two subjects who committed burglaries to landscape trailers at McAdams, having stolen lawn care equipment. Both subjects were arrested and each charged with burglary.
- CR# 1800028 – A warrant was obtained for a home repair fraud suspect. Information was gained that the offender was in Indiana. The geographical limitations of the warrant were expanded to include Indiana. Communication was made with an Indiana law enforcement agency reference the offender who was located and arrested. Detectives drove to Indiana to extradite the offender who was charged with Home Repair Fraud and also had an active warrant from another Cook County agency for a similar offense.
- CR# 1802173 – News of a rowdy Saturday afternoon funeral that came through town resulted in red light camera footage at Harlem Ave. and Roosevelt Rd. being reviewed. The funeral was indeed rowdy with vehicles seen swerving into oncoming traffic and carelessly driving with occupants hanging outside of vehicles. The result was local ordinance citations being mailed to the registered owners of ten autos seen violating village codes.
- CR# 1801676 – A business owner who cashed a home owners check, but never started repairs to the home as promised was hunted down and charged with Home Repair Fraud.
- CR# 1802173 – A liquor license background investigation was completed for Circle Bowl.
- CR# 1802174 and 1802388 – Background investigations were completed for two police applicants.
- CR# 1801913 – A juvenile was identified as the offender in a June Aggravated Vehicular Hijacking. The juvenile was located, arrested, charged, and sent to the juvenile justice system.
- CFMH O'Connor attended and successfully completed Police Motorcycle Operator Training through Northwestern University Center for Public Safety.
- L. Riggins compiled a detailed list of police calls at the 711 Desplaines Ave. CTA Terminal from 2016 to 2108.

Forest Park Criminal Investigations Division members are experienced and dedicated public servants who have built and continue to maintain professional relationships within the community and with neighboring agencies in an effort to quash criminal activity and to solve as many cases as possible.

Auxiliary Unit

July 2018

North Riverside Little League Parade: Wednesday, July 4th North Riverside held their annual Little League Parade. Auxiliary officers were sent in one of our marked vehicles to drive in the parade.

July 4th Fireworks: The Park District of Forest Park held their annual fireworks show at the main park along Harrison. This was a mandatory detail for the auxiliary unit with 20 officers arriving for duty at 1530hrs and worked until 2300hrs. The officers were tasked with closing Harrison St. from Desplaines to Circle and providing traffic and crowd control throughout the event. The event was well attended and aside from a few minor incidents was a success.

Groov'n in the Grove: On Tuesday, July 17th one auxiliary officer was assigned to the Grove to provide security and traffic control for the "Groov'n in the Grove." From 1900hrs to 2300hrs.

Music Fest: Friday, July 20th through Sunday July 22nd the 4th annual Forest Park Music Fest took place on Madison St. The street was completely closed and fenced off from Desplaines to Circle Avenue throughout the 3 day event. The auxiliary unit was tasked with assisting the Music Fest security detail by providing high visibility foot patrols and assisting event staff where needed. Numerous Auxiliary officers were assigned to the detail throughout the 3 day event. There were no reported major incidents during the event requiring law enforcement action within the festival grounds.

No Gloves Softball Tournament: This Year's "No Gloves Tourney" started on Thursday, July 26th and concluded with the championship game on Sunday, July 29th. During the event auxiliary officers provided security for the players and the citizens who attended. Officers provided traffic control and monitored the side streets surrounding the event for parking violators and for criminal activity. The auxiliary unit also provided overnight security for each of the nights during the event for the vendor's equipment.

August 2018

Living Word 5k Run: On Saturday, August 18th the Living Word Church held their 2nd annual 5k walk/run. The event kicked off at 0900hrs and ended at approximately 1100hrs. The course was set up in a circle pattern around the Church utilizing Desplaines, Roosevelt, Circle and 16th Streets. Two Auxiliary officers assisted the Forest Park Bike Officers with providing traffic control and security for the participants.

Kid's Triathlon: On Saturday, August 18th the Park District hosted their 7th annual Kids Triathlon. The Triathlon started at 0800hrs and concluded at approximately 1100hrs. A total of five auxiliary officers worked this event and were tasked with closing Harrison St. from Ferdinand to Hannah and providing traffic and pedestrian control throughout the event.

Groov'n in the Grove: On Tuesday, August 21st one auxiliary officer was assigned to provide security and traffic control for the "Groov'n in the Grove." From 1900hrs to 2300hrs.

Training/Meeting for July & August:

The Auxiliary Unit held a training meeting on Saturday, August, 18th at the Forest Park Police Department Roll Call Room. During the meeting we discussed the numerous up and coming events and reviewed the department's Use of Force Policy.

Firearms/Range

The Range staff conducted handgun training at the end of August which will continue in groups through the rest of the year. Patrol Rifle training has been planned and will be conducted in the coming months.

Accident Investigation

WESTAF Major Crash Unit is fully operational and will handle all major crashes which usually involve fatalities. Sgt. Hall is the Director of this branch, he will be submitting the monthly reports regarding MCU. For July and August, the unit was requested to assist a mapping scene from a shooting incident scene at North and 1st Ave in Melrose Park. On August 24th the unit was activated for a pedestrian who was fatally struck on Manheim just north of North Ave in River Grove.

LESO

Ammunition requisitioned almost a year ago was received from the Military. 9,000 rounds of rifle ammunition was received at a considerable savings to normal State Bid pricing. There have been no other acquisitions of note.
